Dear Members and Friends of Westminster Presbyterian Church,

As we come to the close of this year, I find myself deeply grateful for the privilege of walking alongside you in ministry. This year has held both holy moments and hard conversations—times of celebration, times of grief, and times that required patience, courage, and trust. Through worship, pastoral care, shared leadership, and quiet faithfulness, we have continued to show up for one another. That in itself is no small thing. God has been present in our gathering, our listening, and our willingness to remain together even when the path has not always been clear.

This past year has also asked a lot of us. We have navigated change, differing perspectives, and the weight that long histories can carry in a congregation's life. These challenges have not defined us, but they have shaped us—inviting us to practice grace, to slow down, and to remember that the Church belongs to Christ, not to any one generation or moment. I have seen resilience in this community, a quiet determination to keep loving, serving, and discerning God's call together, even when the work has felt demanding.

I am thankful to share that Session has renewed my contract for another year of ministry, including a cost-of-living adjustment. I receive this as a sign of trust and commitment to our shared work, and I do not take it lightly. I remain called to serve with integrity, pastoral care, and faithfulness to our Reformed tradition and our Presbyterian way of being church—grounded in covenant, mutual accountability, and hope for what God is still unfolding among us.



As we look ahead to the coming year, my prayer is that we continue leaning into who God is calling us to be now—not who we once were, but who we are becoming. There is meaningful ministry ahead of us: deeper relationships, renewed purpose, and opportunities to serve both one another and our wider community with compassion and courage. Thank you for your faithfulness, your prayers, and your presence. May the God who has carried us this far continue to lead us forward, together.

Hello Lynn and Westminster Presbyterian Church,

I wanted to take the time to tell you how much we appreciated the donations! The families were in awe of their baskets.

Families apply in October and their applications are screened as we review their expenses and income- only those in most need are accepted. This year due to the generous donations we received, families were given a turkey, a pumpkin pie with whipped cream, fresh produce, a variety of holiday staples for dinner, and general groceries. The amount of food each family is given depends upon the family size. During the application process, families provide us with a list of each child's interests, and we do our very best to match toy donations to the interests of the child.

In the pictures you will see two Mom's alongside our staff- they received one basket full of food and a second basket of toys, carefully hidden in black bags so the kids don't see and can be surprised on Christmas day! The family in picture 488 even received a bike!

We were able to serve 139 families with over 500 individuals including 261 children. We would not have been able to do this without your help!


